2004 Race Series Trophy Presentation

Winter weather curtailed the 2003-04 Frostbite Series so no trophies were awarded. Eric and Joleen Rasmussen dominated the Saturday and Sunday Multihull Series in 2004. Alan Wolf took first place in the Saturday Series and Eric Rasmussen was awarded second place. A single point separated these two Isotope warriors. On Sunday, Eric Rasmussen sailed to a first place in the 2004 Sunday Multihull Series and Joleen trailed in second place.

In the Saturday Monohull Green Division, Ken Warren captured first place in his Lightening. Herb Bodman took second place in his Tanzer and Bob Moates followed in third place in his Flying Scot. On Sundays, John Hemphill took the top prize in Monohull Green Division in his Flying Scot, Bob Moates snared second place in his Flying Scot and Ken Warren received third place sailing his Lightening.

Later Ken noting that his Sunday performance did not match his Saturday performance opined that perhaps he should curtail his Saturday post-regatta socializing.

The Club awarded only one trophy in the Monohull White Division. Bill Byrd sailed his Newport 16 to first place.

Past Commodore John Goodman leaves the Board having served as a flag officer and most recently Club Secretary. Esther Khoury has served as the Club Treasurer since 1997 and was recognized for her service to the Club.

Sonja Hughes leaves the Board having managed the successful 2004 Major's Cup Regatta.

Remaining on the Board in 2005 will be Keith Smoot as Cruise Director and Randy Crum as Membership Director. Jean Leslie moves to direct the Mayor's Cup Regatta after a year organizing Social events, Pam Reynolds will move from editing the newsletter and the Directory to serve as Secretary. Bill Grossie will become Newsletter/Directory Editor. Past Commodore George Bageant will be responsible for chairing the Nomination Committee.
