SATURDAY SUMMER RACE SERIES

On Saturday May 7, at 9 am Lake Townsend looked like a piece of glass. Then, as the boats assembled along the dock and the skippers meeting started, a few puffs of wind gave way to what appeared to be a steady wind from the west. However, the wind proved to be typical of Lake Townsend and settled into a pattern of shifting 30 to 60 degrees on fiveminute intervals. PRO Bill Grossie kept the safety boat crew of George Bageant and Bill Byrd busy adjusting the course right up until just a few minutes before the first warning was sounded. Thirteen boats took to the course with four Isotopes and four Flying Scots. The fleet also consisted of two Tanzers, an MC Scow, a Force 5, and a Lightning. With the Mayor's Cup only 4 weeks away, it was the perfect day to prepare for the club's major summer event. At the social which followed the races, skippers, crew, race committee members, and club members who could not be there for the races enjoyed hotdogs, hamburgers, and a hearty helping of "sailor fellowship". SUNDAY SUMMER RACE SERIES

On Sunday, May 8, sailors were greeted by a cloudless deep-blue sky and generally steady north winds of 5-10 mph. PRO Bill Grossie set an Olympic course with the windward mark in the first cove that extends to Doggett Road. This created a long course that provided some real challenges for the racers as they sailed into the cove. Two races were held and competition was keen in the first race for the white fleet with corrected time finishes within three minutes of each other.

As the wind increased slightly for the second race, getting into that cove for the windward mark proved to be an even greater challenge. Wind shifts and direction changes were observed from the committee boat and many times two boats on the same tack were heading more than 20 degrees different from each other. In all it was a great day

on the water. Thanks to the race committee of Bill Grossie, George Bageant, Wayne Jones, Steve Raper, and Lew Johnson. Members are reminded that serving on the race committee is a nice way to participate in club activities, get to know other club members, and learn about sailing. Our next race weekend will be the Mayor's Cup and of course, volunteers are always welcome. We will be putting all safety boats in the water and the committee boat is the best place to see all the action! Call Lew Johnson for details.

CRUISING NEWS

April turned out to be a disappointment with storms and lack of promotion for the cruising calendar, but May just might be better. The Trailer Safety Seminar was well attended, both by new and wanna be trailer owners and old hands lending suggestions and insights. Thanks to all who made the day a success.

The next trip will be a Saturday-Monday cruise from Oriental, NC starting May 21. We will leave Greensboro about 7:30 on Saturday morning and return on Monday. We will launch from the Wildlife access ramp at Hwy 55 in Oriental and spend two nights on the water, visiting Turnagain Bay and possibly a state park on the south side of the Neuse River. We will return to the ramp for the trip home, sometime Monday. Call me at home for details and to convoy with us.

The next seminar will be on Coastal Navigation and GPS use. If you have a GPS, I plan to give you some on the water practice with a scavenger hunt. Each boat will be told what co-ordinates to go to first, and then pick up further instructions at each waypoint after that. Following a course, programming the GPS and speed on the water will count. I also plan to have a short talk on coastal navigation as used during on of our typical cruises to the coast. I will also have my navigation computer running "The Capt'n" navigation program. This seminar and scavenger hunt will be Saturday,

June 11 at Lake Townsend. Bring your boat and GPS. A boat hook or net may be helpful.

After that, the June cruise is June 24-26 on Lake Jordan, leaving from the ramp at Ebenezer Church State Park. We may meet in Greensboro for breakfast so call me for details. This is a great ramp and good cruise, with many Bald Eagle sightings last time.
