Many boats were not able to get across the starting line within the time limit, and some boats that did were not able to finish within twenty-minutes of the first boat in their class. Sunday started hazy and humid, but by 10 am, the blue sky was evident and we anticipated a breeze. Again, no wind greeted the sailors; and after a patient wait

by the sailors and race committee for wind, racing on Sunday was abandoned.

The Oriental Cruise was a reminder why I usually schedule coastal cruises for mid to late summer. It was windy. Gwaihir hosted a non-sailing couple who were not ready to tackle a 30-degree heel, but who had complete confidence in their skipper. Gwaihir had an easy sail in a couple of protected creeks while Wanda coached Larry on the tiller. I handled the sails and Larry's wife, Edna enjoyed the day. We briefly anchored with two Paceship 23's, skippered by Starling Gunn and George Bageant. The wind was a little high and Gwaihir was sailing at anchor too much to cook dinner, so we motored into a cove for the night. Larry fished from Gwaihir's deck while the girls and I cooked dinner. Marinaided ribs and steak accompanied by roasted

corn came off the grill, while baked beans, potato salad and toasted rolls came from below. Everyone had their fill, with steak left for breakfast. The main cabin on Gwaihir converts to one big bed, with a nice V berth forward of the mast. The four of us slept in comfort, swaying gently at anchor. Starling and George went across the creek to Adams Creek for the night and all slept soundly. After a breakfast of steak, eggs and sweet rolls Gwaihir and guests were ready to sail to Adams Creek to show the Paceships how to handle the wind. As soon as I can get the engine to start, my trusty Nissan 5hp was acting up. The wind was blowing directly into our anchorage, so sailing out was impossible. Starling heard me talking with George on the radio and offered to tow us out of the hole I had dug for us.

I continued working with the engine until Starling's Paceship came into view, then I readied my towline. 150 feet of 3/4" yellow polypropylene with ten feet of messenger line and heaving knot connected us to Starling's Amazing Pace for the tow to clear air. We gratefully dropped the tow and Larry steered us back to the Oriental Wildlife Access Ramp. Larry and Edna had to leave Sunday morning, and took some fond memories with them. I worked on the engine for about an hour before Wanda suggested we head home too. No engine, winds building and blowing directly into the dock, both of us too tired by then to enjoy the lively sail to Adams Creek. Home sounds good. Starling was so close to us because he had previously arranged to pick up some fresh caught dolphin fish in town. After the rescue, he continued on his way, providing a great dinner for himself and the other cruisers. Not being there myself, I am not able to do justice to the dinner, judging from the reports I have heard. When you get the chance, ask Bill Byrd, George Bageant or Starling Gunn about the Oriental fish dinner. The next cruise will be to Lake Jordan. June 24-26. Report of the Cruising Seminar: Coastal Navigation and GPS

I was not able to attend this seminar so I asked George Bageant to fill in. Bill Byrd assisted him. The instruction centered on reading nautical charts and using that information to enter waypoints into a GPS. Using a divider and the charts, the latitude and longitude of any given point can be deciphered. With the latitude and longitude plotted, a course will appear on the GPS. These two aids to navigation, a chart and GPS will almost surely guide you anywhere you want to go, and in relative safety. Thanks George and Bill for stepping in and sharing your skills.

The next seminar date has been changed. The Boat Systems and Radio Protocol Seminar has been change to July 16, still at the Lake Townsend Marina. We will have some cruising boats rigged and either on the water or on their trailers, depending on the wind. Seminar participants will have the opportunity to climb aboard these boats and inspect rigging, electronic installations, cooking, water and toilet systems, as well as anchoring and docking equipment. The proud skippers of these boats will be aboard to answer questions and perhaps offer a sail. As always, the seminar begins at 9:00AM, and ends at noon, or whenever the last boat gets off the water. Everyone is invited, bring a life jacket.
