Maine Windjammer Trip by Roving Reporter, George Bageant

Betsy and I left Asheboro Friday evening (August 6th) and drove over to Greenville, NC To spend the night with our friends; Ken and Diane. We left the following morning headed for Camden, Maine. We were all going on a weeks sailing trip on the Schooner Mary Day, which is a 100 ft long two masted schooner.

After spending Saturday in Manchester, NH, we arrived in Camden about 5:00 pm on Sunday evening. After stowing all of our luggage in our cabins we were free to go into town to shop and eat supper. We would sleep on the boat that night and the Mary Day would leave the dock the next morning about 10:30 am. We would not be back to Camden until the following Saturday morning.

The town of Camden, Maine is very famous for it's quaint beauty, especially the harbor area. It looks like it should be on a picture postcard, and it is! The Mary Day was built in 1962 especially for the tourist trade. It is made completely of wood and is just as beautiful today as the day it was first launched.

We had 28 passengers on board from all over the country and we were all good friends by the time the week was over. We had two captains on board (married), their two children, four crewmembers, and the cook.

Everything is provided while you are on the boat including some of the best home cooked meals you are likely to have anywhere. And it's all cooked on a wood stove! I had to get back on my diet when I got back home.

We left the dock on Sunday morning and the itinerary was...there was no itinerary! We would be going wherever the wind blew. We would be stopping in a different anchorage every night,

somewhere amongst the islands off the coast of Maine. Typically, we anchored off small villages on different islands. The Mary Day's small yawl boat was available after supper to take anybody ashore that wanted to go and explore the towns.

Usually about 8:30 to 9:00 p.m., everybody was heading for their cabins. Getting up at 7:00 am, eating wonderful food, seeing great scenery, helping raise and lower the sails and the centerboard, and even getting to drive the boat if you wanted to made for a very full day. Then you had to get up and do it again the next day!

Somebody had to do it, right?

Tuesday night was lobster night. We anchored and took the small boat into a sandy beach where the crew prepared a wonderful steamed lobster dinner for us with all the trimmings! We were advised to

We were advised to start with two lobsters and to work our way up from there. Three was the best I could do! There were birthdays to be celebrated, so one night we had chocolate cake with fresh ice cream churned by us (Kiwi ice cream?). You just had to be there.......

All too soon, it was Friday night and we realized we would be returning to Camden and our trip would over. We arrived at the dock about 9:30 am on Saturday morning and after saying goodbye to the captain's and crew and all of our newfound friends we loaded up the car and began the long trip back down to North Carolina. We left Camden about 12:30pm and drove straight through, getting back to Asheboro at 11:00 am the following Sunday morning. With four people driving the trip was fairly easy, but a long time to be cooped-up in a car! This was a wonderful sailing adventure. We wound up sailing over 170 miles in a weeks time and some of it was at speeds approaching 10 kts with the leeward scuppers almost in the water! This was the fourth time that Betsy and I have cruised on the Mary Day and we highly recommend it!
