Online Nautical Charts

If you are like me, the Internet is a first source of information on all things nautical. So, without hesitation I went to online to find information on nautical charts for some of those areas I hope to cruise this summer. Very early in my search I found the website by a map publisher MapTech (http://www.maptech.com/), and noticed a link at the top right to online maps. If you follow that link, you will be presented with a page with two links: FreeBoatingCharts.com and the MapTech Map Server.

The easiest link is the Map Server, clicking on that presents a page that you enter the name and state of the location you want to get a map for viewing and printing. I entered Washington, NC clicked the "GO" button and then selected the Washington Yacht Club from the list. A map appears along with a little pop-up window that you can easily close. At the top of the map is a tab that switches the map from a topo to a nautical chart. With a little experimentation with the zoom feature and the help of the Fun Tools Print feature, you can print a letter-size map. My chart of the entrance to Broad Creek going into McCotter's Marina and the Washington YC is small, but with my enlarged copy provided by MapTech, that I keep in a plastic page protector, I have a handy reference chart that's easy to read.

The second link requires a little more computer skill. For the FreeBoatingCharts you'll need to go to the download section of the MapTech web site to download and install Chart Navigator 5.07c - With Demo Chart. It is located in the Top downloads area. Once you download and install that program. After the program was installed, I went to the FreeBoatingCharts

(http://www.FreeBoatingCharts.com) web site and selected the "click here to get started" link. Use the "select on a map" option, and after you get a list of charts, select the chart of charts you want and click on the "Download selected charts" link. After you create an account, the chart will arrive

as an email attachment. You will save the map file and open it using the Chart Navigator software that you installed earlier. The email will take some time to arrive, so open the Chart Navigator software and read the help files. The features of the Chart Navigator software are awesome. You can plot a course, measure distances, get GPS coordinates, and print off enlarged charts sections.

Have fun planning your next cruise.
