Racing Report: From Gusty Spring to Scorching Summer to ?

To say it's been a bad year for sailboat racing at Lake Townsend would be an understatement. Strong winds and cold weather blew out racing in February, March, and April. Mild and moderate spring weather lasted only a blink. Summer arrived with a vengeance, bringing blistering heat and dead air. By this time of year, if we cancelled no races, if we had three races every Saturday and two races every Sunday, we would have had 34 races to date; however, we've cancelled 19 potential races and completed 15. Ironically, the first Saturday in January was the best day for racing all year, with steady and moderate breezes and temperature near 70 degrees. Global warming?

The heat did not deter club members from the August races. With the help of junior sailing

students who turned out with friends and family for a Junior Regatta, and with a good turn out from the Flying Scot fleet, we had the most boats on the water since the Mayor's Cup. - six!

Maybe September will bring us better conditions. At least it can hardly get worse. Flying Scot sailors - we're serving race committee in September. See you at the marina about 8:30, Saturday morning, September 1.

October's Saturday racing will include an interclub regatta with Carolina Sailing Club. We hope this event will help promote sailing in the Triad and Triangle regions. A notice of race is being drafted and will be soon distributed.

While skippers and crew sat around on shore waiting for some wind to arrive for the August racing, we had an exchange of tips about sailing in light air conditions. Here's my report on

the discussion. Take it with caution from a guy with faulty memory and a bad reputation for light air sailing.

- Finding the wind: To sail in light air you've got to read the movement of the air. Bill Byrd's goose feather and sewing thread are essential, unless you can get a peacock feather from Keith Smoot. Smoke drifting off a good cigar also works well.
- 2. Keep the boat moving: Avoid tacking and jibing as much as possible. If the boat is ghosting along, moving the sails to the other side of the boat may stall it completely. This can be tough to execute because it means you may not be able to sail the shortest course to a mark, which runs against competitive logic. It also means being patient with wind shifts. On hot, light air days, the wind can spin through every point on the compass. I've been in races where all the legs of the race are upwind, or downwind, or where we sail to the windward mark without ever tacking and to the leeward mark without ever jibing.
- 3. Balance the boat: Move crew weight around to get as much of the hull out of the water as possible. This means different things for different boats. Flying Scot sailors sit as far forward as possible to keep the broad stern from dragging. Tanzer sailors put as much weight as possible on the leeward side.
- 4. Use the proper sail trim: whatever this is. I've heard what seems like contradictory ideas. I assume it depends on how the sails are cut and the point of sail. Greg Fisher, a national Flying Scot champ and sail maker says to loosen the outhaul and allow a bit more belly in the sail. Erik Rasmussen says he tightens his mainsail to get it as flat as possible. He says less belly, more flat, allows air to flow more easily over the back of the sail in the light air, thus producing more lift. Maybe flat or loose is a matter of upwind versus downwind. You guys who

always beat me in light air, how about clarifying this.

It will be okay with me if the wind blows enough in September so we don't have to practice light air sailing. Be there. If you don't like how the wind is blowing, adjust your sails!
