Summer Series Starts with a Great Day

The First race of the Summer Series was on Saturday. The turnout was great! The weather all week-end was fantastic. Being it was the first race day of the season, everyone was enthusiastic to get out. There were 15 Boats: 12 Flying Scots, a lightning & it was great to see Phil and his son were there on a Laser and Sunfish. The weather was supposed to be cool but on the water it was wonderful. 3 races were run.

Joe Brake, whose boat is out for refit, was sailing with

Steve Morris. His wife Stacy sailed with us. The wind was scheduled to shift directions in the middle of the day and as the first race progressed it did. There was the usual lake winds where the downwind run was really up wind. In the second race, using this wind shift to our advantage, since the wind was not square to the starting line and was strongly favoring one direction Uwe started on the pin end on port and tacked immediately to starboard and in front of everyone else. The first half of the race went really well, until we came to the mark in the cove where the wind died. We sat in this hole and when the next breeze came in, it was from behind the rest of the fleet! We sat 50 yards from the mark and watched the procession of boats rounding the mark before we were finally able to move.

It was great to have such perfect conditions for our opening day and a fun time was had by all – even those of us stuck in a hole!

The interclub also started out on a high weather note. Dave Bachelor even thanked Uwe for providing such good weather. But of course commenting on the wonderful weather is only a curse for dead air.

21 Boats turned out. 15 Scots, 2 Thistles, 2 Tanzers, 1 Buccaneer (where were you Bill and Sonya?), 1 Lightning, and our newest member, Alan Taylor, in his

Windmill.

The first race was a windward leeward – of 2 short laps. The air was around 7 knots.



Because the winds had shifted during the race the lines were reset, The second race was again Windward-Leeward of 2 laps. But the curse of goodair had set in and the winds began to be fickle and fall off. Chris Maginnis on the committee boat, commented at the end of the race that some of the finished boats couldn't completely clear the line and he suggested to them that they might paddle away so that there was clear space for others to drift in.

During the last drifting bit of the second race, it seemed to be that the finished boats decided that the race for the beer might be a little more tempting than a third race and the boats all floated off ½ heartedly toward the marina. Eventually the race committee blew the horn and raised the AP over A and cancelled the rest of the races for the day, at which point the race to the marina began in earnest, paddles drawn. Some even taking the duck line and being towed in.

There was a special social, Rachel in her first ever (& highly successful) grilling feat cooked hot-dogs and Hamburgers.

We had 20 members at the lake yesterday for work day. I hope to provide a more detailed report, but wanted to give you the highlights.

We returned the one Capri - repaired by Starling Gunn and Hudson Barker, and rigged the boat. We took one Capri out of commission. It is upside down on the trailer back behind the Wardens tool shed. We don't think it is worth repairing, but we are going to let it dry out and decide.

We took the Aqua Fin from between the sheds out for repair.



We inventoried the sails, patched the Pico sails. We have two Pico sails that we've marked to not be used until more repairs are done on them. We did some rigging repair, and replaced two Aqua Fin mainsheets. Various hardware repairs – replacing rivets, reattaching blocks, etc., were performed. The cradles for the Capris were coming apart so we bought some brackets and reinforced them. Thanks to Tom Bews for his multiple trips to Lowe's and donation of cleaning equipment.

We cleaned the boats. We are going to try to leave the Rudders up and see how they fair.

We sanded and varnished the club bulletin board.
