A Great Day at LTYC Ends With a Flight Simulation

46 sailors representing 26+ boats left the breakfast social/competitor meeting looking forward to a great day of racing and commradrie. Race Committee set up nice courses in the shifty/gusty winds. Our newest Isotope sailor joined the Lake Townsend Swim Club as he first tested the leeward wind conditions in race 1 and then the weather rounding conditions in race 2. I think this is par for the course for the lighter Isotope sailors. After all, my first year skippering, every time I went out, I went over.

Towards the end of the social, we hailed "batten down the hatches." Almost immediately, the winds picked up and visibility dropped to less than 20 feet. We huddled as much out of the wind as possible (with the shorter sailors finding spots behind taller sailors), but there wasn't a dry spot in that long shelter. As visibility started to return, eyes were on the beach, looking to count masts, wanted to see 3. We saw 1.

Arriving at the scene, it seemed to us that my Isotope had decided to try flying, and used the mast of the leeward Hobie as a spring board. Neither boat was up to the challenge. Though my Isotope ended up on top, the Hobie won the skirmish. I think my boat can be repaired, (Frank is after all a magician) and the Hobie damage was limited to a busted forestay with masthead decapitation, and a bit of damage to the mast. On the other side of the parking lot, the Scot had also tried to fly but wasn't able to use the adjacent mast as a spring board. I don't think there was any damage to the Scot.

Rangers reported wind speeds up to 50mph. Once again, we were reminded of how much we value being well off the water when the storms come in. Tomorrow's forecast promises a little less excitement.
