That New Buoy is a Duck Light

Through a cooperative effort between LTYC and GBO Parks and Recreation, a goose light buoy has been installed at Lake Townsend. LTYC furnished the re-chargeable battery, battery box and charger. Clint Richardson, Parks Specialist, reconditioned an old buoy and wired it up with a strobe light, attached it to the battery unit and lit it up. This may deter the geese from using the sailboat dock as a roosting place. We will monitor the dock to see if the buoy works.


Special thanks go out to our volunteers on RC/SCAT duty and all those who helped with registration, scoring, set-up and clean-up,

A TALE OF TWO SKIPPERS

There are two well known skippers from the British Navy of the early 1800's. Each was known to have been quite demanding of his crew. Their different leadership styles had remarkably different outcomes.

Officer "H" was credited with multiple victories in numerous campaigns. He commanded several ships. He developed a reputation as a fierce combatant as was feared by many of the commanders who served for opposing navies.

Officer "W" also skippered several ships. It is assumed that his superiors were pleased with him, as W continued to receive promotions throughout his entire career. The support of his crew was debatable.

Part of the style of H was to win by developing superior tactics. While he was demanding, he also developed the abilities of the crew. The crew gave him faithful support.


The battle for which H is most famous is a battle into

which he entered with fewer ships, fewer guns and fewer men than his opponent. He reportedly entered as quickly as he did because of the support and encouragement of his crew.

The reputation of H, also known as Horatio Nelson, is that at Trafalgar, he kicked butt against the navies of the Spanish Armada and the French. Even though he was mortally wounded there, he had developed his crew well enough that they continued on to win the battle.

W, also known at William Blye, is not famous for winning. His outcome was not so good. What made him famous? He was famous for the outcome of the Bounty. One of his later commands also had a mutiny. Then again when he had shore duty, there was yet another rebellion.

Blye was known for an "acid tongue." He was a screamer. Humbly submitted with assurances this is not in reference to any club members, but rather was discovered as part of management exercises in the submitter's workplace and seemed worth sharing.
