January 9, 2016 Frostbite Series By Jim Heffernan

The first racing of 2016 for ardent LTYC skippers and crews came off in spite of temps in the mid forties and initially light winds. The light winds kept the wind chill from discouraging the eight crews that hit the starting line promptly at 12:05. Winds at this time were 4.0 mph from the north-northeast. Thirty-two minutes later the first Flying Scot, piloted by Steve Jones, completed the WD course just ahead of Uwe Heine and Nancy Collins in their Scot. Jon Mitchell's Wayfarer DNF'd due to a very





young and cold crewmember as the chill factor increased when the wind filled in to 7.6 mph by the last leg.

The adept RC ran up the AP for a few minutes and then got the second sequence going by 12:40. Winds were now averaging 8 mph as another WD course was used. Alan Taylor and Stephanie DeLair in Windmill 4501 took advantage of a late shift as the prep flag came down and walked away quickly from the pin end and stayed well ahead for the whole 25 minute race.

With more wind available, RC put up the W2 course after moving the leeward mark more squarely to the northerly backing wind. At the start, Luke Hayes in Laser 200622 found the sweet spot along with Alan and Stephanie and they led the fleet through the shifty winds. Downwind, those with spinnakers seemed to have trouble keeping them filled as boats covered one another on the short course. Two of the finishes were one second apart and were exciting to watch from the signal boat.





Even though one crew (unnamed) on the mark boat was threatening to mutiny, all of the sailors stayed out for a quick W course in 7 mph winds. Once again, the Windmill led the way followed by Uwe and Nancy in a Flying Scot and AnnMarie Covington and Susan Cole sailing AnnMarie's Wayfarer, *Epiphany*.

At 2:20, RC arrived at the pier, happy to get in four exciting

races on a day that did not have a favorable forecast. Warm vittles and desserts were waiting at the ranger station along with a toasty room to get the blood flowing again.






