

Mayor's Cup Recap

We had 14 Scots among the 50 or so boats on Lake Townsend last weekend. The weather turned out better than forecast in every respect, more wind than expected and none of the rain. On Saturday we ran three windward-leeward races in shifty, spotty winds, with Don Smith and Chris Kicinski of Lake Norman Yacht Club outsmarting the shifts to win two and Ray Merrill of Carolina Sailing Club with his light wind speed winning one.

Sunday was absolutely booming with winds in the 10 to 20 mph range. We had a nice, long, two lap windward-leeward followed by an Olympic course, both featuring screaming, side-by-side planing under spinnaker. Chris Herman and his son Gabriel won both on their home lake.

Although they never won a race, Tom Bews and Nick Huffeldt switched skipper/crew roles and took consistent seconds and thirds to win the regatta. Don Smith and Chris Kicinski finished second, my son Silas and I finished third, Ray Merrill and his young crew Alex White fourth, and Chris and Gabriel fifth.

Two regattas down, five to go. Seven boats raced both Great 48 and Mayor's cup and so are half way to the four races needed to qualify. Of those seven boats, I am at the top of the leaderboard, with Steven Jones and Chris Herman, both of Lake Townsend Yacht Club, close behind.





Adopt-A-Boat Program by David Duff, Commodore

LTYC will once again host the Tanzer 16 Nationals competition this September 17th & 18th. What you may not realize is that our club has a fleet of six Tanzer 16s ready for sailing. If you would like to compete in this event, you've got about three months to practice and get to know the boat. Specifically, if you would like to get to know a particular Tanzer, we're inviting you to participate in what we are calling "Adopt a Boat". Our vision for this program is for an individual club member to take some ownership for the upfitting, tuning and "nice to haves" of "your" boat in return for the first right of usage at club events between now and the Nationals and, of course, use of "your" boat at the Nationals. Needless to say, club usage is not restricted to racing events; these boats can also be used at the monthly social sailing events and, after 3 events, outside of regularly scheduled events. There will be plenty of time for you to hone your boat and your skills.

For those who feel they do not have the necessary skills, the Equipment Committee will offer assistance.

If you would like to participate in this program, use the 2016 Club Boat Usage scratch sheet (under Participation Scratch Sheet on the home page) to reserve your dates and make a notation in the notes. See the club boat usage policy for more details. The club is not financially prepared to purchase new sails or major equipment for these boats (but would welcome donations!) Expenditures for desirable repairs and upgrades should be discussed with our Equipment Committee Chair (Scott Bogue). The hope is that this program will inspire members to 1) defend our club's honor at the Nationals; 2) get involved with improving the fleet; and 3) use these available Tanzer 16s on a regular basis for both pleasure and competition, especially if they do not own a boat.



Centerboard, rudder, tiller, tiller extension and spinnaker pole, all blocks and cleats, all sheets and halyards are in excellent condition. A compass is mounted behind thwart. It has a ratchet block for the main sheet. A jib furler is on the bow, a very useful addition. Also included are aft bench seats.

A Pamco tilt trailer with 12 inch wheels and spare tire is included. Has new wheel bearings, seals and bearing buddies. Boat cover is 3 years old, in excellent shape for mast up or down storage. Epiphany is ready to race or cruise!
