






Here's a Map to Help You Plot Your Course

The 2016 Wayfarer Worlds at Heeg, Friesland

The Wayfarer International Championships attracted sailing crews from the USA, Netherlands, Canada, Denmark, United Kingdom, Ireland and even South Africa. Our Dutch hosts made some boats available for overseas competitors and the Wayfarer Mark IV manufacturer, Richard and Mark Hartley, brought some new boats from the UK which were used by three Canadian crews. The best finish was done by the Canadian crew of Sue Pilling and Stef Romaniak. They finished third in the 2013 Worlds in their beloved W397 but this time with a borrowed Mark IV they came in eighth in the Gold Fleet. In the Silver fleet. Jim and grandson Sean Heffernan did a respectable fifth. Entering the last day of racing, they stood in 11th place but managed a 4th, a 5th and a 7th to move ahead to the trophy circle.

Heeg is an old nautical town situated on a shallow freshwater lake in the Dutch province of Friesland. Many years ago the lake was a peat bog that was eventually flooded and then it became part of the interconnecting chain of canals and

Jim and Sean returning to the starting line lakes that crisscross the province. Since the holiday season was in full swing, many sail and power craft were around and sometimes on the race course during the Worlds week. There were times that it was necessary to tack away from a dead air zone downwind of a huge sailing barge or a training or charter vessel. It was easy to get distracted looking at the many traditional wooden sailing ships that sailed through with tan bark sails and enthusiastic kids learning the ropes.

Most of the previous Championship regattas have been held on open water with somewhat steady wave patterns. The Heegermeer, being shallow and with a lot of traffic, gave us oddly shaped waves from multiple directions.

Because of the heavily used buoyed channel adjacent to the racing area, the Race Officer restricted the number of boats allowed on the starting line. We did start with 56 boats for the practice race on a course that was too short for the winds, allowing some top boats to finish in 20 minutes, much to the surprise of

the RO who did not know how quick the Wayfarer could be. For the rest of the week the races were closer to an hour in length and the competitors were divided into two starting groups of Gold and Silver/Bronze.

Three qualifying races were sailed on Monday with four fleets picked by lottery doing a round robin series to determine placement for the remainder of the week. This worked quite well, with the groups separated by five minutes and with some sailing the inner trapezoidal loop and the other the outer loop. The unique course setup kept the first group from sailing through the other group on the downwind and kept both groups separated by a few hundred meters until the final beat to the finish line. Maybe we should try this at Lake Townsend when we have two large starting groups like at the HOT.

Naturally there were some unhappy folks but in the end all realized this was the best approach to provide fair racing on the Heegemeer and give all an even chance on the starting line and on the course, which had enough non-racing traffic to keep your eyes and brain very busy.

For the most part the wind was very light all week. Of course the best wind came on the off day while most of us were biking around the countryside





checking out the windmills, lovely farms, and charming pubs along the canals. As we looked across the fields, sails filled with wind sent unseen hulls along the dike-protected canals and past the indifferent cows and sheep.

This regatta belonged to the Danes from the Scandinavian Wayfarer Association, who came in force and with good training. Some sail in the club with the famous Paul Elvstrom of Olympic fame and perhaps picked up a few tips from the master. The top finishers in both the Gold and Silver fleets came from Denmark, with the Bronze going to the Netherlands.

The next World Championship will be held in Ireland, either on an inland lake along the river Shannon or at one of the clubs on the Irish Sea.


