#### A Trick at the Helm

Helmets become *Haute Couture* at Lake Townsend!



Leading the fashion edge – Wendell Gundlach shows us that helmets are not only the correct sailing gear but meet with great sailing fashion. Never will the baseball bat of the boom again permanently indent your noggin, leaving you adrift "breath side down" in the murk of the lake.

Sailors from MIT to the America's Cup are stylin' in their helmets. There are many options. Wendell has opted for a white helmet, which down in the South will keep you cooler than the black option (right):

Remember when sourcing your helmet that a snazzy bulldog hood ornament might get caught in the mainsheet when you duck under the flying boom. Get the sleek design – perhaps with a bit of a visor to shade the eyes or you can opt for the cap under the helmet as Wendell does.

Helmets have been used in football since 1920 and in baseball since 1971. Helmets are now worn in most other active sports such as skiing, horseback riding, bicycling and motorcycling; many freedom-loving bikers opt for helmets. The brain is a tender thing. STEM – Science, Technology, Engineering and Math

Sailing seems to attract the types of people who are working in some sort of STEM-related activity. Pilots, chemists, mechanically minded types, farmers, people who like to tinker with their hands or play logic games, the general outdoors type. Even music and art have close connections with STEM.

STEM fits very well into sailing.

Last month I went down to a US Sailing sponsored symposium in Austin, Texas. The demonstrations on STEM had lots of fun things to do. They were very exciting and I would like to share that excitement.

Our "Let's Go Sailing" Event (May 20th) is a perfect opportunity to show off not just our love of sailing but our love of all things relating to STEM.

Below are some of the ideas that might be fun to have in a booth:

Simple Machines - A "simple machine" scavenger hunt using a boat on a trailer, and/or create an example of how different arrangements of blocks can assist in lifting a load. This would be the perfect time to break out the blocks and build examples of how much easier it is to lift a bucket of water when your blocks are 6:1 vs 1:1.

Any high school students need a chance to start on their science experiment? I have an Arduino if you want to make an autonomous sailboat. Or ... Girl Scout badge - Anyone have an ROV? - What is at the bottom of the lake by the dock?

I invite everyone out to show their love of STEM. Create a booth, participate in a booth that is created. You don't have to be in school, you can just love science and to tinker with neat stuff.

Here is a fun opportunity to show everyone we aren't just out there drifting about, that behind sailing is a wide world of Science, Technology, Engineering and Math topics and principles.


