HOT 6 Recap

It takes a lot of teamwork to get a regatta together, as those of you who've done one know very well. But it's not all hard work. HOT 6 was also fun, rewarding, and fulfilling, thanks to the help of many.

It also takes a lot of brainstorming to figure out what will sell in our auctions. Many thanks to Way-farer Fleet 15 for their creative ideas for the auction. This year we had an abundance of wonderful homemade items and services that sold very well!

The sailing weather wasn't bad on Saturday, but Sunday was a different story. Those intrepid sailors who ventured out in the cold, dreary weather on Sunday were rewarded with some great sailing winds. Unfortunately, as they came in to put their boats away, the sky opened up. Not a single complaint was heard. Thankfully there was hot coffee waiting to warm them up.

HOT 6 raised about \$5,000 this year, for a total of \$38,000 since the first HOT. As you know, our HOT Charity Regattas raise money for Earlier.org. Earlier.org funds grants for researchers who are specifically working on finding an earlier test to detect breast cancer, in an effort to eradicate the need for invasive surgery and chemo. Each grant is \$40,000. We need approximately \$2,000 more to get to that number, then we'll have a grant named in our honor. Wouldn't that be an awesome achievement?

If 50 members or guests donate \$40 each, we can make it!




