This year's Mayor's Cup started off with an informal Friday night



was delicious.







Who Sez Nothin' Exciting Happens at Lake Townsend?

It was a dark and stormy evening on Lake Townse—Oops! Let's try that again. It was a bright and pleasant evening as four Capri sailboats drifted slowly away from the floating dock, making their way past the breakwater and fishing lures out into the quiet waters of Lake Townsend with their adult beginner class crews. This would be the perfect evening for the new sailors to learn how to handle a two person boat, using their crew communication skills

while mastering the mysterious and often confusing language of "nautispeak." What could possibly go wrong? As the teaching staff fired up the SCAT boats and prepared to get underway there came a strong odor of gasoline drifting around and we saw a flurry of activity near the boat launch. It appeared a justlaunched powerboat that was still attached to the pier was quickly sinking. We motored out of there before the gasoline slick spread along the bulkheading toward our LTYC storage shed.

Out on the lake all was peaceful as the adult students tried to understand the jib and the working sheet and lazy sheet. Looking back toward shore we could see

fire trucks arriving along with the Hazmat response team and a lot of activity. Lake Activity Specialist Clint Richardson and his team were deploying containment booms around the fuel spill and laying absorbent pads on the gasoline.

After an hour or so we could see that the floating white booms now closed off the harbor so we checked with lake staff member Wayne Williams, who advised us to beach the boats on the sand for the night and tie the SCAT boats to the fishing pier. We dropped assistant instructor Bill Young on the beach to help the students as they got the unexpected experience of beaching a boat with a centerboard and rudder.

Meanwhile the environmental crew was sucking up the fuel and they continued working into the night to make the harbor safe again. Two tow trucks were used to raise the unfortunate boat and place her on a trailer.

On Saturday morning the class rigged on the beach as an onshore breeze began and with assistance from Bill Young and Jason Gustavson they made their way upwind, with only a little help needed as one boat tried to tangle with the fishing pier.

As the fleet returned to the marina, the lake staff advised us to bring in only two boats at a time and requested that Jason use the SCAT boat to temporarily move the containment booms that blocked access to our floating dock. All students landed safely with assistance from assistant instructors Dawn-Michelle Oliver, Linda Heffernan and Robert Uzzle. We tied the SCAT boats on the far side



Did you know LTYC subsidizes instructor and powerboat safety training courses? We are leaving Wednesday (June 13th). Things are getting hectic trying to pack and tie everything up here for a couple weeks.

We will be hitting the ground running as soon as we land, getting footage of the prep and setting up to film the start at 5 am the next morning. We'll be working on the daily updates for the race, so you can see our work on social media or on the race website. We will also be contributing to the photos that go out to support the race. Want to learn more about sailing? Here's how to get a crew spot.

Crewing for an experienced sailor is the best way to learn. You can crew during races held on the 2nd Saturday of the month, or crew during our Social Sails held on the 4th Saturday of each month through September.

Here's how you do it: go to www.laketownsendyachtclub.com and click on Scratch Sheet: Participation signup. Scroll down to the green section titled "Available to Crew" and put your name and phone number and/or email in there.

Another way to crew is to show up on race day or social sailing day. Come to the skippers' meeting, usually held at 11 a.m. and tell the group that you'd like to crew.

Here's an example of the section of the scratch sheet where you'll sign up.
