Sailing for us were Jack McArthur, Emma McArthur, Will Niven and Jackie Denenny. The team was chaperoned and coached by George Bageant, who also towed one of our C420s for our sailors to race.

Next up was HOT VIII late in the month, sailed in ideal fall conditions. The teens mixed it up with the adults, outpacing several Open Monohull Division boats on corrected time! The team had seven different high school sailors race on three of our C420s: Will and Jackie, Jack, Emma and Logan Hayes, and Monica Pla and Nino Criscuolo. Jack, Emma and Logan were first in the C420 Division, followed by Will and Jackie.

We will practice only on Saturdays in November due to shorter days. Up next for the team will be the OHYC-LTYC Interclub on November 9, and we will close out our fall season with an Invitational Regatta against Research Triangle Park High School Sailing Team at Jordan Lake on December 8.
